#### SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Digital submission of letters, club news, event reports, articles and advertisements is preferred. Suggested lengths are up to 200-250 words for letters and club news; 200-500 words for reports and articles of interest to square and round dancers.

We can handle most document formats including doc, docx (preferred), odt, ppt, pptx, pub, rtf, txt, and wpd. Paper submissions will either be scanned or retyped. You can also type your submission in an email.

For images we can handle most graphics formats. Please do not resize photos or embed them in a document or email. A minimum resolution of 300 dpi is recommended. For ads we will accept graphics files (including pdf) but we can't edit them to correct any typographical or formatting errors unless you also send us the original document file.

Please include your personal, club, or business name at the beginning of your file names so we can identify files without having to open them. Please attach your files to your email and send to **crosstrailnews@shaw.ca**.

#### All submissions must be received by the deadlines for each issue on page 3.

When preparing an advertisement please note the ad sizes on page 3. If your copy is not the same as our ad size we can adjust the size to fit our page but it will become distorted if the aspect ratio (ratio of width to height) is significantly different. We will make up your ad (and email a proof to you) if you email the details to us.

To prepare a full page ad with the correct aspect ratio, use letter size (8.5" x 11") paper with top and bottom margins of 0.5" and left and right margins of 1.25". If you add a border you may have to change the setting in your word processing software to measure from "text" instead of "edge of page." We will resize the ad to fit a full page.

To avoid missing an issue, club members are asked to report changes of address (with the effective date) and name and address corrections to your club membership person as soon as known. The information reaching me from various sources shows that many clubs have made plans for their usual September restart including, importantly, our seeking to attract new dancers. It is therefore appropriate to remind clubs which welcome newcomers that grants are still available to help with costs. The Class Advertising Grant has been extended for the coming dance year and is available to clubs which have not already received it. The new dancer class funding grant which could be claimed only every other year will, for 2023-2024 ONLY, be available to every club offering new dancer classes.

The other initiative of the BCSRDF, following the lengthy discussion on this subject at our 30<sup>th</sup> April AGM, is to create a committee to explore the possibility of establishing classes for aspiring callers, cuers and leaders to be held in BC on alternate years. The committee members are Lyle O'Hara (Chair), Mae Fawcett, Wendy Krueger and Robert (Bob) Simpson. If any member has thoughts or ideas which may be of interest to the committee please forward them to theoharas@telus.net. Our counterpart in Alberta is encouraging us to pursue our investigation and offered assistance if needed. We are grateful to them for offering their co-operation. If our activity is to grow and remain healthy, new callers are going to be needed to fill any vacancies which may occur and, ever hopefully, to form new clubs.

I trust many of you are also planning special activities to take advantage of Square, Round and Clog Dancing Awareness Week which will be proclaimed for August 27<sup>th</sup> to September 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Looking further into the future, I am pleased to report that Region 2 is hosting a Festival for 2025. The details I have are: "The BC Festival 2025 dance will be at Langley Secondary School, 21405 56th Ave., Langley, BC. The Trail In dance will be at this site in the evening of Wednesday, July 23, 2025 and the festival runs from Thursday, July 24<sup>th</sup> at 1:30 p.m. until Saturday, July 26<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 p.m. Look for more details when registration opens in early January 2024."


