BC Federation has been working towards becoming a communication hub. The BC Fed supports a Zoom account for any club or member wanting to set up a zoom meeting within the dance community.

Updating the leader directory database of callers, cuers and prompters. Setting up and maintaining the Region Chatter page on the Federation web site as well as revamping many of the pages of the website to make them more user-friendly, like the updated Handbook section and links to the Region 5 resources for posters, caller training and new dancer training created by the Turners. There are many ways to post and share your dances, club news, find a caller, cuer, prompter in another region for a special dance or just to share some info (just contact Frank McNeil our webmaster and new president. fmcneil@shaw.ca.)

fend for myself on the dance floor. It turned out that there was no problem in finding dance partners on the floor. People just showed up to make sure that all the squares were full, no problem.

This in fact became a place to re-acquaint past acquaintances and make new friends with people from across Canada. We all were able to learn and consolidate all our past teachings, refine our best moves, learn new moves and be introduced to new techniques from renowned instructors. Then we could practice on the floor with a wide variety of callers from across our continent. What a pleasure to be able to attend.

If this is just an inkling of what the BC Square and Round Dance Festival is going to be like in 2025, you had better sign up now for the 2025 BC Festival in Langley next summer. Then of course there will be the 2026 Canadian Square and Round Dance Festival in 2026 proposed to be somewhere in BC during the summer of 2026. Let your imagination take it from there!

TEN GUIDELINES FOR ENJOYING YOUR SQUARE AND ROUND DANCING

- 1. Have fun and enjoy the friendship of your fellow dancers.
- 2. Be exuberant but not so much so that other might take offence at your antics. Remember to be inclusive and welcoming to all those around you.
- 3. Welcome visitors and make them feel part of the club they came to enjoy the dance as much as you do.
- 4. Dance with as many callers and cuers as possible to form your own opinion of their merits. Remember opinions of others are as subjective as your own so do not take them as gospel.
- 5. Remember that strong fragrances of any kind can adversely affect the health of others.
- 6. For the enjoyment of the dance environment, and to create a positive atmosphere, dances are drug and alcohol free. Everyone must be able to participate fully so that they enjoy their time together.
- 7. You and your fellow members are the backbone of your club. Your loyalty and participation are of prime importance for the enjoyment of everyone in the square and round dance community.
- 8. Bickering, fault finding, and gossip are atmosphere killers. Avoid them.
- 9. Once in a square do not walk away from it. Doing so is a slight to those already there.
- 10. Remember that you were once a beginner you can still learn, and everybody goofs at some point no matter how experienced they are.





If your copy is not the same as our ad size we can adjust the size to fit our page but it will become distorted if the aspect ratio (ratio of width to height) is significantly different. We will make up your ad (and email a proof to you) if you email the details to us.

We can handle most document formats including doc, docx (preferred), odt, ppt, pptx, pub, rtf, txt, and wpd. Paper submissions will either be scanned or retyped. You can also type your submission in an email.

For images we can handle most graphics formats. Please do not resize photos or embed them in a document or email. A minimum resolution of 300 dpi is recommended. For ads we will accept graphics files (including pdf) but we can't edit them to correct any typographical or formatting errors unless you also send us the original document file.

Please include your personal, club, or business name at the beginning of your file names so we can identify files without having to open them. Please attach your files to your email and send to: crosstrailnews@shaw.ca.

All submissions must be received by the deadline for each issue.


