CSRDS NEWS

CSRDS INSURANCE

By Garry Dodds

The insurance that the CSRDS has, which provides coverage to all of our dancers, clubs, associations and their executives, is called 3rd Party Liability Insurance. The policy ONLY covers members of the CSRDS.

What does that mean?

- 1) If you cause damage to someone or something, or cause someone to injure themselves, then you may be considered LIABLE or RESPONSIBLE for that damage and responsible for repair or make up for the loss.
- 2) For the purposes of the policy:

 - a. the 1st party is the insurer and/or the CSRDS
 b. the 2nd party is the individual (includes the club, executive member, association, federation) that caused the damage
 - c. the 3rd party is the individual or entity that was injured, damaged or suffered a loss.

EXAMPLES

- 1) You slipped and fell and hurt yourself at a dance maybe due to loose shoelaces
 - a. You could NOT claim against this policy be- HALL NAMED cause you are not considered the THIRD PAR-TY.
 - b. If you have your own personal accident insurance, you may be able to make a claim under your policy.
- 2) You slipped and fell on a step and hurt yourself at a dance – leaving the hall because of poor lighting and you were not able to see the step.
 - a. Again, the CSRDS Insurance would NOT cover

you however,

- b. you may be able to claim against the Hall's 3rd Party Liability Insurance.
- 3) You tripped someone (accidentally of course) and they fell and hurt themselves
 - a. That person would then qualify to compensation from YOU (maybe through a lawsuit) and then that would be through your 3rd Party Liability insurance.
 - b. If you have homeowners, or tenants insurance, that might cover the compensation and / or the insurance from the CSRDS would cover the compensation.
- 4) Someone in the club left the stove on when leaving the hall and then the hall was damaged by fire.
 - Here the Club and the Club's executive would be covered by the CSRDS Liability insurance, if the hall sued to recover costs to repair the damage.

REQUEST FOR A CERTIFICATE WITH A

One of the common requests some clubs have received is a certificate with the Hall named as being covered.

All this represents is:

- a. Proof that the club is covered by Liability Insur-
- b. That the Insurance Company is advised that this Hall is being used by the insured Club.





Digital submission of letters, club news, event reports, articles and advertisements is preferred. Suggested lengths are up to 200-250 words for letters and club news; 200-500 words for reports and articles of interest to square and round dancers.

Our page size is 8.5" x 11" (letter size) with a 0.5" margin on all four sides. When preparing an advertisement please note the ad sizes on page 2. If your copy is not the same as our ad size we can adjust the size to fit our page but it will become distorted if the aspect ratio (ratio of width to height) is significantly different. We will make up your ad (and email a proof to you) if you email the details to us.

We can handle most document formats including doc, docx (preferred), odt, ppt, pptx, pub, rtf, txt, and wpd. Paper submissions will either be scanned or retyped. You can also type your submission in an email.

For images we can handle most graphics formats. Please do not resize photos or embed them in a document or email. A minimum resolution of 300 dpi is recommended. For ads we will accept graphics files (including pdf) but we can't edit them to correct any typographical or formatting errors unless you also send us the original document file.

Please include your personal, club, or business name at the beginning of your file names so we can identify files without having to open them. Please attach your files to your email and send to: crosstrailnews@shaw.ca.

All submissions must be received by the deadline for each issue.






