70th Anniversary Celebration

On October 19, 2025 the LVIWSRDA, VDCTA, and the Cross Trail News celebrated their 70th anniversary (one year late). The Western Dance Association (WDA) (then for both dancers and callers on all of Vancouver Island) was formed in 1954 and the first issue of the *W.D.A. News* was published in April of that year.

Subsequently the WDA went through several name changes, split into Lower and Upper Vancouver Island regions, callers and cuers formed their own associations, and the W.D.A. News became the Cross Trail News.

The celebration itself was a two and a half hour afternoon dance at Colwood Community Hall featuring caller Murray Few from Edmonton, Alberta. For more on this event see the article and photos on pages 25 and 26.



At this dance certificates recognizing 70 years of activity were presented to the LVIWSRDA, the VDC-TA, and the Cross Trail News by both the Canadian Square & Round Dance Society and the BC Square & Round Dance Federation. EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

The BC Square and Round Dance Federation has given the go-ahead to investigate the possibility of having a Caller's School in conjunction with the 2026 Canadian National Festival in Penticton.

At this point, we have two Canadian CALLERLAB Accredited Coaches interested in being instructors and if necessary, we will be looking at a third Caller Coach.

With two Caller Coaches, the school would be restricted to 20 to 22 students. If more students are interested then we will look at arranging for the third Caller Coach.

Who would be the ideal student?

With the quality of instructors and two potential experienced teaching assistants, this school would be valuable to all callers from brand new to very experienced. In addition to joint sessions, students would likely be split into groups depending on experience and areas of interest.

Dates: Friday, July 10th to Tuesday, July 14th in the city of Penticton (still working on the venue). Friday will start later in the day but Saturday, Sunday, Monday and Tuesday will be all day and evening.

Other Details:

For students, funding should be available from CALLERLAB and the Canadian Square and Round Dance Society in addition to provincial associations and possibly state associations to help offset costs.

Anticipated tuition is \$500.00 CDN per participating student. Spouses and partners are also encouraged to attend and may be requested to assist by providing dancers on which the students can practice. We have also found that partners can be a real help to the students in their learning process.

We are looking at the possibility that lunches may be provided as well as mid session snacks.

To assist with the planning we are seeking "expressions of interest" from those who are interested in attending the Caller's School.






